President's Remarks

The year 2013 has been a year of great importance to our country, our municipality, as well as our Shanghai Institutes of International Studies (SIIS). 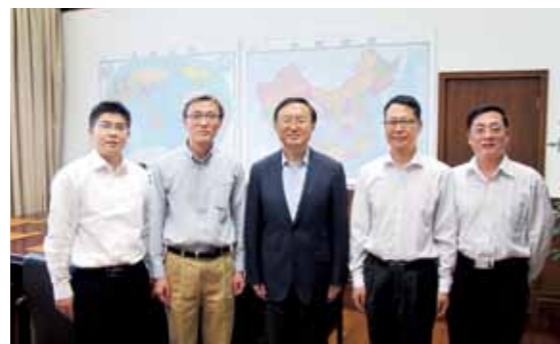

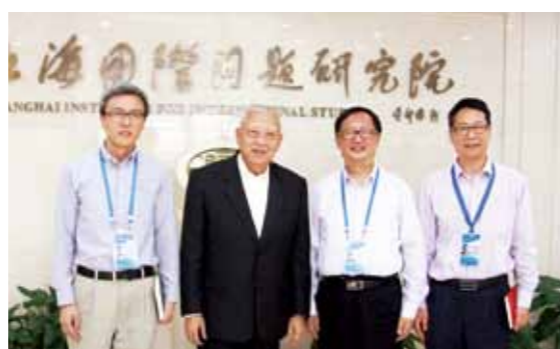

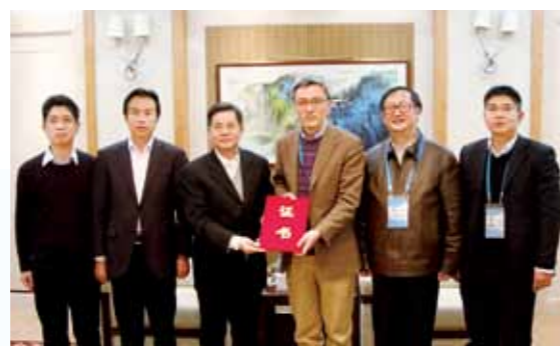
Smooth transition of SIIS leadership.

2013

Year in Review



With the convening of the 18th National Congress of the Communist Party of China, 2013 marked the inauguration of a new central leadership and its start of collective governance of Party and State affairs with new ideas and strategic measures. At the 3rd Plenary Session of the new Party Congress, in particular, a call was raised for in-depth reforms on all fronts.

By summing up our experiences over recent years, we came to realize that development of think tanks in China has entered a new period of theoretical innovation, strategic planning, policy suggestion, information platform development, and public opinion guidance. Based on this realization, SIIS spared no effort to learn, to forge ahead and to make innovations for turning and upgrading it into a new-type think tank serving the diplomatic strategy of our country and answering the call of our municipality to seek innovation, transformation and development, registering new progress one after another.

I. Eyeing for the strategic, forward-looking and operable quality of studies and the national value and local feature of research results, and attaching of equal importance to the study of theories, strategies and policies

Based on its accurate judgment of the changes in the world situation and the general trend of China's development, the new Chinese leadership mapped out an overall strategy on international work and domestic development. While masterminding and orchestrating in-depth reforms on various fronts, it devoted vigorous efforts to promote innovation in diplomatic theories and practices. Apart from development of a whole line of great diplomatic thoughts, policies and strategies, it took a series of important diplomatic actions. Reach of our national diplomacy to a new starting point meant new tasks for SIIS.

At the first step, we carried out earnest study of the spirit of the 18th Party Congress and all the important speeches of the new leaders so as to dovetail our studies with the work of the central and the municipal governments and

broaden our contacts and exchanges with them. We also set up research teams according to the study projects to be launched, thus bringing our studies into close line with the overall diplomatic drive of our country and the development need of our municipality.

Knowing that the studies of think tanks must be pioneering and forward-looking, we stepped up institutional interaction and cooperation with the central government and some local government bodies charged with practical jobs and tasks. We kept promoting our institutional contacts, for instance, with the Foreign Affairs Office of the Party Central Committee, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Taiwan Affairs Office of the State Council, the Ministry of Commerce, the Ministry of Finance, and the International Liaison Department, and were relisted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as a key cooperator in policy studies. Apart from sending researchers to attend various conferences called by central government departments and taking up lots of their research projects, we continued the practice of sending some staff members to work temporarily in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. We also invited more than 40 high-ranking officials from different ministries and commissions for exchanges with our researchers.

Our second step was to implement the important directives of central and municipal government leaders and enrich the strategic and applicative quality of our studies.

Our central government made some important instructions in 2013 on the development of think tanks. Our municipal leaders also urged us in the year to step up studies of macro and strategic issues as well as key policy issues on innovation and transformation. Taking advantage of our cutting edge in the study of diplomatic theories with Chinese characteristics, we focused our studies on the development of new-type relationship between major powers and a new order in border regions, governance of new international domains, promotion of software and public diplomacy, as well as the practice of 'one country, two systems' and the strategy on national unification, paying close attention to integrating strategies with theories, strategies with policies, and macroscopicness with operability. To serve the building of a new type of major-power relations between our country and the United States, the convening of the conference on the diplomatic work on the neighboring countries and some other major developments, we published a series of research reports, winning ward applauses.

In terms of local service, we centered our studies on issues concerning our municipality's application to host the Global City Day, innovation of social governance and cooperation between our municipality and its sister cities, all designed to elevate the international influences of our municipality. We also took up study of some research projects of the Shanghai People's Political Consultative Conference and the Foreign Affairs Office of the Shanghai People's Government, and produced some valuable advisory reports serving the scientific decision-making of the municipal government, winning loud laud from both the central and the municipal governments.

Another step by us was to bring in play our cutting edge as an academic body to strengthen mid-term and long-term planning of studies and enrich the forward-looking and innovative contents of research reports.

By stepping up mid-term and long-term planning of studies and making arrangements ahead of time, we built up a policy reserve for the future development of our municipality and our national diplomatic drive. We followed the



strategic proposal by President Xi Jinping for the development of a Silk Road economic belt and a 21st century maritime Silk Road to plan our projects of study in 2014 and set up a special research group on the summit of the Conference on Interaction and Confidence-Building Measures in Asia (CICA) to be held in Shanghai in 2014 and the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation conference to be held in Beijing in the latter half of this year. We also worked out detailed plans on services to pertinent central and municipal government departments.

II. Devotion of active efforts to development of platforms for academic exchange and dissemination

To bring academic studies to serve exchange and understanding between different cultures and civilizations, help the international community get a full understanding of new developments in China, cultivate a correct outlook on national interests and a mature and rational psychology among citizens is not only a trend of development of think tanks in China, but also one of their key missions.

Based on this understanding, we made active efforts to promote academic exchanges with overseas peers in the hope of supplementing the general diplomatic drive of our country, following a two-way approach – organization of overseas visits and invitation of overseas visitors. When inviting overseas visitors, we kept in mind the need and focus of our national diplomatic development, and the purpose of promoting understanding of our country's diplomatic policies. When receiving US visitors after our country's proposal of the initiative to build a new type of major-power relations, for instance, we briefed them on the connotation and significance of this concept and tried to create an international atmosphere facilitating its propagation. But when receiving researchers and officials from east and southeast Asian countries and regions, we changed to interpretation and discussion with them of China's diplomatic policies on neighboring countries, development of mechanisms for economic and security cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region, maritime rights and interests, and other issues of common concern. In the case of guests from developing countries, we focused the exchanges on China's experiences in reform, opening-up and governance of state affairs. As for overseas visits, we would carry out some in-depth study of the destination countries beforehand, devote earnest effort to on-spot investigation, and get an accurate understanding of their public sentiment and opinion. We never set any limit on the choice of destination countries, a feat as characterizing the limitless coverage of our national diplomatic policy.

Another effort we made in 2013 was to expand the media broadcast of our academic exchanges and step up social transformation of academic achievements. In order to publicize our country's foreign strategies more efficiently and win a bigger discourse right in the international academic circle, we published a number of think-tank versions of strategic reports in 2013, such as *China's Global Strategy 2013-2023*, and reports on the new model of major-power relations between China and the United States including *Co-exploring and Co-evolving: Constructing a New Model of Major Power Relationship between China and the United States*.

We also launched in 2013 an updated version of our official website to improve visual experience, enlarge coverage of news and information, include in-depth analyses and comments so as to strengthen online publicity. Taking

accurateness, timeliness and depth as our chief purpose in website development, we assigned a bigger space to in-depth analysis of current affairs of key importance. Meanwhile, our researchers gave interviews to and published articles in mainstream media outlets for more than 600 persons/times in 2013, including 450 interviews to journalists from Phoenix TV, China Business Network, Shanghai Oriental TV, HKSTV, Voice of Taiwan Straits Broadcasting Station and 121 articles in leading newspapers and journals such as People's Daily, China Daily, Jiefang Daily, Wen Hui Bao, Chinese Social Sciences Today, Sing Tao Daily, the Christian Science Monitor, The Straits Times, The Asahi Shimbun, and Lianhe Zaobao.

III. Acceleration of self-development by increasing service consciousness and through coordination of innovative powers

Think tanks in China experienced a new wave of development in 2013. Taking this opportunity, we made some new explorations into the path of development of think tanks with Chinese characteristics.

First of all, we strengthened theoretical preparations for think tank development, listing think tank development as a priority in our studies. As Dr. Yang Jiemian, Chairman of SIIS Academic Council, once pointed out that think tank development in China has entered a new stage of theoretical innovation, strategic planning, policy suggestion, development of information platforms, and guidance of public opinions, a conclusion conforming to the trend of development of innovative think tanks and offering a theoretical guidance to SIIS's development.

Secondly, we stepped up networking with domestic and overseas think tanks for the purpose of coordinating innovative capacities. Apart from keeping our cutting edge in terms of the extensiveness and closeness of contacts with overseas academic circles, we took an active part in the initiative co-sponsored by the Ministry of Education and the Shanghai Municipal Commission of Education to boost the development of think tanks, becoming a member of the Leading Group in Charge of Development of New-Type Think Tanks in Institutions of Higher Learning. Dr. Yang was also appointed as president of the Shanghai Council of Think Tanks of International Relations.

We also worked energetically to perfect our internal rules and systems, strengthen internal management, and improve staff quality and ability, efforts that not only led to constant improvement of our management level, but also provided a solid ground for our studies and sustainable development.

It is an exchange that is reciprocal. Keeping in view the overall diplomatic arrangements of our country, SIIS has been following a two-way approach to boost international exchanges: sending researchers to visit reputed overseas think tanks and take part in major international symposiums, and inviting visiting scholars from across the globe, efforts designed to bring into play the role of public diplomacy and academic diplomacy. In 2013 alone, it sent more than 120 people in 92 batches to visit 50 countries, while receiving 22 visiting scholars and interns from the United States, Belgium, Fuji, Sri Lanka and some other countries.

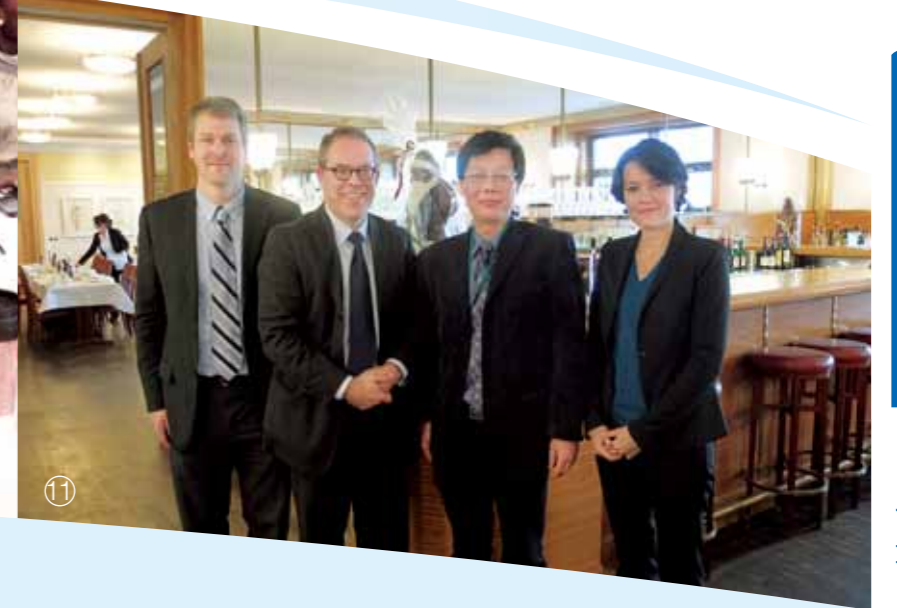

Outlook

for 2014



Following the policy line drawn at the 3rd Plenary Session of the 18th Congress of the Communist Party of China, we will continue efforts in SIIS's institutional reform and boost its transformation and upgrading through improvement and enhancement of staff quality and ability in 2014. Given the new situation and the new tasks of our national diplomacy, which is now at a new historical starting point, we will center all our work in 2014 on the two important conferences to be held in China this year: the Summit of the Conference on Interaction and Confidence-Building Measures in Asia (CICA) and the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Summit. We will also put effort into mid-term and long-term research planning and, in particular, in preparation for the development of our country and our municipality over the coming two decades, taking the upcoming 13th Five-Year Plan on Social and Economic Development as the basis.
